



# Developer of the Year

#### Homes for America



2023 was a year of high impact at Homes for America in all aspects of our work. As we proudly celebrate 30 years of producing and preserving quality affordable housing and serving roughly 7,500 residents with housing and services, we are pleased to be recognized as HAND's Developer of the Year.

HFA completed construction of 233 new homes in 2023 in two properties in partnership with local housing authorities. Homes for Oxon Hill provides 163 beautiful new units serving seniors with a range of incomes. This community was developed by HFA with the Housing Authority of Prince George's County. The second new community that HFA completed in 2023 was Ellicott Gardens 2, developed in partnership with the Howard County Housing Commission. The property serves a range of families from the Baltimore Regional Housing Partnership to families with incomes up to 80% AMI. HFA also completed a major recapitalization of Gateway Village, 156 apartments in 18 buildings for seniors in Salisbury.

Our 2023 accomplishments also included efforts large and small to address resident needs across our entire portfolio of 67 communities in the mid-Atlantic region. Last year, we partnered with several health and wellness agencies to provide onsite physical and mental health services, as well as service providers to address food insecurity and nutritional needs, eviction prevention, digital inclusion, summer camp programming and numerous social and recreational activities.

HFA continued our commitment to energy efficiency and climate resiliency in 2023 – raising funds for energy efficiency improvements at two of our Maryland communities. We implemented water saving strategies at several properties. We were also pleased to be awarded a HUD GRRP Elements grant in the first round.





# Best Small Affordable Housing Project

### 17 Mississippi Apartments



Legacy Real Estate Development and The NHP Foundation (NHPF) are the 2024 Housing Achievement Award winners in the "Best Small Affordable Housing Project" category for their 17 Mississippi Apartments project. This recognition celebrates the standout contribution to affordable housing within the DC, Maryland, and Virginia region, specifically highlighting projects with 100 units or less that have made a meaningful impact.





• A Commitment to Affordability: With all 41 units aimed at 50% AMI, 17 Mississippi Apartments prioritizes affordability, providing high-quality homes for artists, families, and individuals transitioning from homelessness.



- Cultivating Community: The inclusion of a 1,000 sq. ft. artist studio and community room underscores the project's commitment to fostering a vibrant community space.
- Focus on Sustainability: Further enhancing its appeal are its sustainability certifications, including Enterprise Green Community and DOE's Zero Energy Ready Homes.



# Best large Affordable Housing Project

### The Westerly



AFFORDABLE HOMES & COMMUNITIES

Innovative financing is a core element of this new, mixed-income community in the rapidly developing Southwest D.C. neighborhood. Located less than one block from the Waterfront Metro station and three blocks from The Wharf, The Westerly has 449 apartments, with 30% of those dedicated to affordable homes.

The market-rate homes help subsidize the deeply affordable homes and enable Affordable Homes & Communities (AHC) to provide onsite resident services funded by property operations. The Westerly also helps achieve the city's affordable housing goals for this neighborhood.

This development was a joint venture of Hoffman & Associates, AHC, CityPartners, and Paramount. The team combined market-rate equity with equity generated by the sale of 4% and 9% federal and state Low-Income Housing Tax Credits (LIHTCs), a ground lease from the district, and a payment-in-lieu-of-taxes on the affordable units. To access the LIHTC while retaining access to market equity, the project is legally divided into three separately owned and financed entities: one for the market-rate units, one for the 9% tax credits, and one for the 4% tax credits.

The 136 affordable homes include studios, one-bedroom and two-bedroom apartments. Half (68) are available to household incomes at 30% AMI, and half (68) at 50% AMI. The ground lease with D.C. governs the affordability, which extends for 99 years. The affordable homes are interspersed throughout the building, with market and affordable homes side-by-side on every floor.

The 12-story Westerly is adjacent to a grocery store, restaurants, retail, government offices, bus routes, and a Metro station. It has 29,000 square feet of ground-floor, neighborhood-serving retail space.

Property amenities include a penthouse club room and roof-top pool; community room & TV lounge; patio and grilling area; outdoor fire pit; computer room and library; fitness center; and coworking and meeting spaces.

# Fernando Lemos Co-Founder & Former Executive Director



Fernando Lemos is the co-founder and former Executive Director of Mi Casa, Inc. Originally from Paraguay, Lemos is a long-time resident of Washington, DC with extensive experience working with the Latino and African American communities. He is trained in architectural design, housing and community economic development, small business management, and home inspection. Appointed by several city mayors, Fernando served for many years as Commissioner of the District of Columbia Housing Authority. Additionally, he is a past board member of Cornerstone, and a past Community Advisory Board member at the Federal Home Loan Bank of Atlanta. Lemos currently serves on the boards of the Latino Economic Development Corporation and the National Association of Latino Community Asset Builders.

Fernando's commitment to housing as a human right led him to co-found Mi Casa with his colleague David Wiley in 1992. Utilizing tools like TOPA, scattered sites and home purchasing opportunities for limited income residents, Mi Casa created and preserved housing in every ward in the city. Under Fernando's charge, with the commitment of a dedicated team, Mi Casa created more than 3,000 units of affordable housing throughout the city, developed nearly 30% of the District's limited equity cooperatives, and created the Genesis Intergenerational Community, the first program of its kind that provides multigenerational supports for single mothers exiting foster care and seniors living on fixed incomes.

Fernando's championing of Mi Casa's commitment to community engagement and resident-centered development earned the organization recognition in the affordable housing arena such as a multi-million-dollar Neighborhood Stabilization Program award in 2010, the 2014 HAND Award for Best Large Affordable Housing Project (along with Neighborhood Development Company) and the Nonprofit of the Year Award by the Washington Business Journal in 2016.

Fernando is married to BB Otero and is the proud father of Rebecca, Carlos and Gabriel.

# Lee Goldstein <u>Director, National Housing Initiatives</u>

Lee's accomplishments showcase his ability to lead large-scale developments but also his commitment to creating deeply affordable housing units. His leadership in these areas not only benefits VOA, but also sets a precedent for the entire industry on how strategic policy engagement and innovation can address critical housing needs.

# Racial Equity in Action

### Kindlewood | National Housing Trust & Piedmont Housing Alliance





Built in the late 1970s as a 150-unit 100% Section 8 property on a 12-acre superblock, Garrett Square Apartments symbolizes the era of urban renewal. The apartments were named for the street on which they were built, which was part of the former home of Alexander Garrett. An associate of Thomas Jefferson, Garrett enslaved more than 50 African Americans on his estate, known only by their first names in census records.

In 2002, Piedmont Housing Alliance and National Housing Trust purchased and renovated the property, and the residents renamed it Friendship Court Apartments. With a unit mix consisting of 2-, 3- and 4-bedroom townhouse-style units, Friendship Court has provided hundreds of families with safe and decent affordable housing. However, the community remained economically and physically isolated from the rest of the city for decades.

Given its proximity to the burgeoning Downtown Mall, PHA and NHTC recognized the potential for wholesale redevelopment of the site. They also recognized that robust, authentic resident engagement was the only way to keep residents' interests at the center of rebuilding their neighborhood.

In 2017, PHA and NHT began a resident-led process to redesign and rebuild the neighborhood for the 425 residents who called Friendship Court home, 85% of whom are non-white, with the majority being Black residents. Throughout, the process has been led by an elected resident Redevelopment Advisory Committee. Members of the committee are paid for their time and provide lived-experience expertise to co-design their community redevelopment, including selecting the architect, designing the site layout, defining the unit mix, and prioritizing the development of a new Community Resource Center, a preschool, a public park, and a community farm. The project is a testament to the power of resident participation, demonstrating that those most impacted by housing disparities must be central to crafting solutions.



# HAND at a Glance

#### GenerationHAND

HAND has always been dedicated to convening and educating current industry professionals, but we have doubled down on our commitment to lifting up the next generation. Through our mentorship program and the GenerationHAND scholarship program, HAND is helping prepare the affordable housing and community development leaders of tomorrow. We had 24 pairs of mentors/mentees participate in this year's mentor program, and we are excited to present the 2nd Annual GenerationHAND Scholarship recipient during tonight's program.

#### **Training & Capacity Building**

Sharing ideas and best practices is essential to the work we do. Throughout the year, HAND hosts several training programs and series to build members' capacity to address and advocate for policies that will help increase the affordable housing supply throughout the region. HAND serves more than 450 individual and organizational members, covering 26 jurisdictions.

#### Affinity Groups

HAND affinity groups are small, peer-to-peer groups that focus on different industry sectors. We host quarterly meetings for members to exchange ideas, share best practices, or troubleshoot problems with other industry professionals. Current groups include Resident Services, Asset Management, Environmental Justice, and GenerationHAND.

#### **Housing Indicator Tool**

HAND launched the Housing Indicator Tool (HIT) 4.0 in March 2024. HAND is dedicated to taking bold steps to build public and private will, and to catalyze action that addresses housing affordability in our region. This year's tool included data from almost 30 jurisdictions, including data from three Richmond jurisdictions for the first time.

Launched in March 2021, this first of its kind platform provides the most up-to-date information on housing production across the region, a comparison with established local housing targets, and a high-level evaluation on the effectiveness of local programs and policies intended to bolster affordable housing production. Released on an annual basis, the tool provides in-depth jurisdictional data that is critical in making the case to decision makers and community stakeholders for affordable housing production. Most importantly, the tool is grounded in racial equity.

Throughout the year, HAND also hosts a number of activations highlighting jurisdictions and industry leaders across the region who are making powerful strides to address our region's housing needs. These events build on the data and policies that can be found on the platform, while inspiring others in the ecosystem with innovative strategies and insights that can drive housing production. The tool includes a series of calls-to-action, so you and your organization can start turning advocacy into action!
